James W. McGuire is Professor in the Department of Government at Wesleyan University. He specializes in the comparative politics of developing countries, with a particular focus on democracy, social welfare policies, and public health. He is the author of *Peronism without Perón: Unions, Parties, and Democracy in Argentina* (Stanford University Press, 1997) and of *Wealth, Health, and Democracy in East Asia and Latin America* (Cambridge University Press, 2010), which won the 2011 Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Science Research. McGuire is a recipient of Wesleyan's Binswanger Prize for Excellence in Teaching.
