### **Work in Progress**

"Democracy and Cash Transfer Programs." Research for paper to be submitted to an academic journal. In the years leading up to 2015, cash transfer programs in developing countries, in which the government gives money to the poor (with or without conditions like sending children to school), benefited an annual average of just over one billion people. Panel poisson regression analyses of 143 developing countries observed annually from 1990 to 2015 find that, controlling for GDP per capita, population size, and incumbent ideology, governments in democratic regimes, as opposed to autocratic regimes, were, in any given year, 2.5 times as likely to introduce any cash transfer program, 3.0 times as likely to introduce a number of such programs, and 4.4 times as likely to continue to operate such programs. These incidence rate ratios rise even higher after adjusting for the programs' cost and reach (numbers of beneficiaries).
